FLOOR SCHEDULE AND BILL SUMMARY

[H.R. 5576](#) – Transportation, Treasury, Housing and Urban Development, the Judiciary, the District of Columbia, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act for FY07 (*Rep. Lewis {CA} – Appropriations*) (*Continue Consideration*). This bill provides \$139.7 billion: \$64.72 billion for the Department of Transportation including trust fund resources (\$15.15 billion for the Federal Aviation Administration, \$37.62 billion for the Federal Highway Administration, \$8.93 billion for the Federal Transit Administration, and \$1.08 billion for the Federal Railroad Administration); \$11.55 billion for the Treasury Department (\$10.48 billion for the Internal Revenue Service); \$35.30 billion for Housing and Urban Development (\$15.77 billion for tenant-based rental assistance, \$5.47 billion for project-based rental assistance, \$4.2 billion for Community Development Fund); \$6.06 billion for the Judiciary (\$5.77 billion for the Courts of Appeals and District Courts, \$76 million for the Supreme Court); \$575 million for the District of Columbia; \$723 million for the Executive Office of the President (\$52 million for the White House salaries and expenses, \$76 million for the Office of Management and Budget, \$27 million for the Office of National Drug Control Policy); 17 million for the Election Assistance Commission; \$57 million for the Federal Election Commission; and \$109 million for the U.S. Postal Service. This bill also provides federal civilian employees with a 2.7% pay increase.

Yesterday, the House completed general debate on [H.R. 5576](#) and considered several amendments. Today, the House will continue consideration of this bill.
