The House will meet at 12:30 p.m. for morning hour and at 2:00 p.m. for legislative business. Votes are postponed until 6:30 p.m.

Suspensions (4 bills):

- 1) **H.Con.Res. 358** - Authorizing the printing of "History of the United States Capitol" as a House document (*Rep. Larson - House Administration*)
- 2) **H.Con.Res. 359** - Permitting the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a ceremony as part of the commemoration of the days of remembrance of victims of the Holocaust (*Rep. LaTourette - House Administration*)
- 3) **H.Con.Res. 357** - Permitting the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a ceremony to award a Congressional Gold Medal to Dr. Dorothy Height (*Rep. Watson - House Administration*)
- 4) **H.Con.Res. 264** - Authorizing and requesting the President to issue a proclamation to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the birth of Constantino Brumidi (*Rep. Mica - Government Reform*)
