- 1) **H.Con.Res. 5** - Providing for the acceptance of a statue of Sarah Winnemucca, presented by the people of Nevada, for placement in National Statuary Hall (*Rep. Gibbons / House Administration*)
- 2) **H.Con.Res. 63** - Permitting the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a ceremony as part of the commemoration of the days of remembrance of victims of the Holocaust (*Rep. Ney / House Administration*)
- 3) **H.Con.Res. 45** - Recognizing the benefits and importance of school-based music education (*Rep. Cooper / Education and the Workforce*)
- 4) **H.Res. ____** - Honoring Jewish students and teachers on their seven year completion of the 11th cycle of the daily study of the Talmud (*Rep. Weiner / Government Reform*)
